On 4/19/2010 at approximately 2:40pm Britney came to office to get me stating that Ms. Jackie Stevens was at front window inquiring why she can't be in Judge Cassidy's courtroom? I informed Britney that I would find out. As Britney and I were headed toward the reception window, Judge Cassidy had come out of court to inform us that the case is an Asylum case. I go to the reception window and inform Ms. Stevens that the case is an asylum case and that is why the judge has asked her to step out. She goes on to respond:

Why did the judge tell me to leave as the hearings are public? She also stated that the respondent may be afraid. I explained to her that according to procedures she would have to adhere to the judge's request. She stated there is no such policy for that and you are telling me that the judge is correct about not allowing people into a public hearing. Explained to her that I wasn't making any statements other than she would have to respect the judge's request for her to leave the courtroom.

She goes on to explain that the judge has a 93% denial rate for asylum claims and the respondents may be afraid to talk to him and let his country become aware of his intentions to apply for asylum. I informed her that the respondents are allowed representation, but since she isn't the representative she may not be present if the Judge has asked her to leave the courtroom. Ms. Stevens stated that the respondent did not ask her to leave the courtroom the judge did. She goes on to say there is no such policy that states she can't be in there and we just want to keep the respondents in jail.

I explained to Ms. Stevens that I have guidelines that I must follow as an employee of the Immigration Court. She asked for my name and I gave her Marion Crosby. She stated I'm not going to go back and forth with you but I'm sure you understand. She then looks around the waiting area and asked two respondents if they were attorneys. They responded no. She stated I know you all heard what she stated to me and that's not right, no good. Then she saw Judge Houser through the reception window, and yelled "Judge Houser you are a witness". I was not aware that the Judge was there he came to check on his interpreter, so he excused himself from the situation.

She sat down in last chair on the front row and began to write in her booklet. I asked if there was anything else I could assist her with? She stops writing, looks up at me and stated very rudely "what are you looking at". I gave her no response. Based on her persistence I went to security and informed them that the Judge did not want her to be in courtroom 5. Officer Haynes was proceeding to the Immigration Court waiting room, and I informed him that I was not requesting for her to leave the building, but she is currently not allowed in courtroom #5. The officer indicated that he understood and still proceeded to the waiting room. I heard the officer ask her to come with him. Ms. Stevens asked why? By this time I was back in the secure area of the court office space, and I proceeded to the back with Judge Houser and Britney to assist with the status of the interpreter for his afternoon case (A# [REDACTED]). The interpreter was a no show. Ms. Jackson, head of security came to the court shortly after and she indicated that Ms. Stevens was asked to leave the building and did not want to do so. Ms. Jackson indicated that she was escorted out of the building and stated she would write up a report for FPS as she has on numerous occasions been very disruptive and confrontational.

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
